High Grounds Farm Audishaw Lane Boylestone Derbyshire DE6 5AE Proposal Siting of 2 mobile poultry units

The Chair invited Members of the Public to give their views on the above proposals

Both Mrs Harman and Mr King stated that the Village infrastructure was not good

Lane causing potential issues on the approve from the Square due to bad visibility. enough to support any more large vehicles .

Councillors were also concerned that previous assurances about Vehicle Sizes and routes to be used into the Village given to the Parish Council when approval for the first tranche of units was debated had not been adhered to.

Large Lorries were coming down from the A515 along New Road and struggling to turn left into Audishaw Lane

The State of Audishaw Lane and its drainage had deteriorated over the last 12 months due to the impact of the heavy vehicles now using the Lane

Audishaw Lane was not wide enough to permit the use of HGV's and concern was raised about the continued deterioration of the verges when vehicles did meet

Audishaw Lane was used by pedestrians accessing dwellings and walks along its length and it was felt that the increased presence of HGV's was a safety issue given the lack of pavements or other refuges.

Councillors agreed to object to the application on the above grounds
